A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 34-GA-17, CD1

"Relative to funding an actuarial study on the feasibility of a regional health insurance plan for the peoples of the Freely Associated States, namely the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands and the Federated States of Micronesia, and, in connection therewith, to request that the United States Ambassadors to said Freely Associated States formally communicate this request to the Office of Insular Affairs."

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2013, the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures ("APIL") adopted APIL Resolution 32-GA-01 CD1, expressing support for a regional health insurance plan that shall be portable and shall incorporate advanced medical care for all APIL member states and territories if not all the jurisdictions that constitute the Blue Continent; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 34th General 6 7 Assembly, July 7-10, 2015, Island of Pohnpei, FSM, that the Association of Pacific Island 8 Legislatures hereby support the funding of an actuarial and proposal development study to identify in detail the specific features of a health insurance plan for the peoples of the 9 Freely Associated States, namely the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall 10 Islands and the Federated States of Micronesia, which shall include, but not necessarily 11 be limited to: (1) administration and governance; (2) benefits package and limitations; (3) 12 financing and pricing based on actuarial analysis; (4) participation of APIL member 13 states; (5) sustainability; (6) potential next steps for broadening a supplemental regional 14 health insurance plan into a regional accountable care organization; (7) exploring the 15 potentiality of a universal health care system; and (8) portability; and 16

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall submit a formal request to the United States Ambassadors to the Freely Associated States, namely the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia, to formally communicate this request to the United States Department of the Interior Office of Insular Affairs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify, and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall be transmitted to the Chief Executives and the Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of the Pacific Island Legislatures.
