A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 37-GA-09

"To endorse, as the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, the proposed designation of Ant Atoll 'a protected turtle sanctuary,' in order to promote and facilitate sea turtle life."

1 WHEREAS, Pohnpei State is home to various species of sea turtle, namely: 2 the green turtle, hawksbill and leatherback; and WHEREAS, nearly all species of sea turtles are classified as "endangered", 3 since they suffer from poaching, habitat destruction, accidental capture in fishing 4 gear and the impact of climate change on their nesting sites; and 5 6 WHEREAS, it generally takes 30 years for a sea turtle to mature from a 7 hatchling to an adult capable of reproducing, this further compounds the dwindling population of our sea turtles; and 8 WHEREAS, although sea turtles lay many eggs, beyond digging a nest into 9 which their eggs are deposited, mothers do not care for the hatchlings; and 10 **WHEREAS**, following a 60 day incubation period, these hatchlings must fend 11 for themselves and after climbing their way out of the nest through about two feet of 12

WHEREAS, on undeveloped beaches, the moon or starlight reflecting off the ocean is the brightest thing visible to these hatchlings in their perilous journey to the water's edge and given the fact that numerous nesting sites for sea turtles have been identified in Ant Atoll, it constitutes an ideal location for advancing conservation efforts aimed at increasing this especially vulnerable population; and

sand, scramble down the beach toward the water, guided by light; and

WHEREAS, tracking information recently gathered by researchers, concerning an adult sea turtle which had been tagged, revealed it had traveled a

remarkable 2,118 kilometers (or 1316 miles) in order to reach Ant Atoll, presumably to nest; and

WHEREAS, information on the status of sea turtles in Pohnpei is currently in short supply, the prime location of Ant Atoll, as evidenced by these numerous nesting sites, makes it an ideal location for monitoring sea turtle nesting, gathering data for conservation researchers and preventing predators from getting at the eggs and the removal of sea turtles themselves and/or their eggs will also be safeguarded in this environment; and

WHEREAS, as the collective body of Pacific Island Legislatures, we affirm our support and commitment to the designation of Ant Atoll as a turtle sanctuary to promote and facilitate sea turtle life by increasing their number and thereby avoiding extinction of these species; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 37th General Assembly, FSM State of Pohnpei, June 26-29, 2018, that this Assembly hereby fully endorses the designation of Ant Atoll as a protected turtle sanctuary, as proposed by Traditional Leader Rohsa of Ant Atoll and expresses its sincere gratitude for his initiative, in terms of furthering the conservation efforts of Micronesia; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify and APIL Secretary attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be transmitted to the Chief Executives and Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures and the Traditional Leader of Ant Atoll, Rohsa.
