A RESOLUTION

Resolution No. 38-GA-02

"Calling upon the APIL Member Jurisdictions to engage in regional cooperation to combat climate change through the continued development of, and commitment to, renewable energy."

WHEREAS, the theme this year of the APIL General Assembly is *Renewable Energy:*Alternative energy solutions for Micronesia and the Central Pacific; and

WHEREAS, climate change presents formidable and universal challenges to all the peoples of the Pacific region, including: coral bleaching, rising sea levels, coastal flooding, and shoreline erosion; and

WHEREAS, the history, culture, and communities of all the peoples of the APIL Pacific are deeply rooted in respect for, and preservation of, the environment; and

WHEREAS, history has proven the power and effect of collaboration and mutual assistance in addressing the challenges posed by climate change; and

WHEREAS, energy consumption and renewable energy critical areas of development, with renewable energy sources providing reliable, resilient, safe, and clean sources of power, the use of which also slows down the adverse impacts of climate change; and

WHEREAS, recalling past APIL resolutions on climate change, it is the continuing sense of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures that we should consolidate our efforts and aspirations as expressed in both present and past climate-change resolutions, and that we should take bold, positive actions to implement the ideals and objectives of these resolutions, both in our

own separate Member Jurisdictions and, through regional cooperation and collaboration, for all of the islands and waters of the APIL Pacific; and

WHEREAS, it is the further sense of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures that furthering the joint commitment of the APIL Members to the development of renewable energy through the collaborative identification, design and implementation of specific island and regional plans and projects, is a necessary and critical step in advancing our shared commitment to combat climate change; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 38th General Assembly, Republic of the Marshall Islands, July 23-26, 2019, that the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby calls upon the APIL Member Jurisdictions to engage in regional cooperation to combat climate change through the continued development of and commitment to renewable energy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each Member Jurisdiction is respectfully requested to include in its country report at the next APIL Board of Directors meeting, an analysis of the progress of that Member in its respective renewable energy program, which report should include that Member's endeavors to provide for the sharing with all Members of the APIL, that Member's challenges and accomplishments in freeing its power production systems from dependence on fossil fuels; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify and the APIL
