A RESOLUTION

Resolution No. 38-GA-10

"Relative to recognizing and commending the 38th APIL for its largest representation of women leaders and encouraging Members Jurisdictions to promote the advancement of women in all stages of life, including in leadership and public office in their jurisdictions."

WHEREAS, the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL) was established in 1981 as a permanent association of mutual assistance by representatives of the people of the Pacific Islands; and

WHEREAS, APIL has enjoyed nearly four (4) decades of success in regional cooperation, coordination, exchange, and assistance and has created monumental differences in the lives and conditions of the peoples and governments within their jurisdictions and the region; and

WHEREAS, in November of 2018, the people of Guam elected their first women-led majority into the Guam legislature, which is also the first supermajority of women legislators across the United States and its territories. The Honorable Speaker Tina Rose Muna Barnes, and the Honorable Senators Régine Biscoe Lee and Kelly Marsh (Taitano) were selected to represent the people of Guam at APIL; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2017 and March 5, 2019, the people of Chuuk elected the first two women in history to lead in State Government, the Honorable Senator Gardenia Aisek and the Honorable Representative Shining Sos, and in July of this year, the Pohnpei State Legislature also recognized Mayleen Shoniber Scaliem as Senator which brought the total of women in leadership within APIL to its highest levels, that being six (6) women directors; and

WHEREAS, each Member Jurisdiction of APIL shall continue to support efforts that provide avenues for the advancement of women in leadership, public office, education, business and other important societal institutions; and

WHEREAS, such efforts will help to promote gender equality in the region and empower all women and girls who represent half of the world's population; and therefore, also half of its potential; and

WHEREAS, inequalities faced by women across the globe begin right at birth and follow them all their lives. As girls move into adolescence, gender disparities typically widen; and

WHEREAS, gender disparities affect girls' education, and disadvantages in education translate into lack of access to skills and limited opportunities in the labor market. Therefore, each Member Jurisdiction must ensure inclusive and quality education and equal opportunities for women and girls, which will help to reduce inequalities and to reach gender equality; and

WHEREAS, to achieve a truly inclusive society, it is important that governments, civil society and communities work together to implement lasting solutions to ensure inclusive political participation at all times; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 38th General Assembly, Majuro, Republic of the Marshall Islands, July 23-26, 2019 that it hereby encourages that all Member Jurisdictions continue their efforts to support the advancement of women in all stages of life, including in leadership and public office; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that APIL President shall certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall be transmitted to the Chief Executives and the Presiding Legislative Officers of the Member Jurisdictions of the Association of the Pacific Island Legislatures.
