## A RESOLUTION

## **APIL Resolution No. 39-GA-08**

"Expressing appreciation to the governments of the United States and Australia and to UNICEF for providing desperately needed humanitarian assistance to the people of the Republic of Kiribati who are suffering from the severe hardships of an extended drought."

WHEREAS, the Republic of Kiribati consists of thirty-three low
lying atolls spanning a distance of approximately 1,800 miles across the
vast expanses of the Central Pacific Ocean; and

WHEREAS, in June of this year, the Republic of Kiribati declared
a State of Disaster for the whole of the Kiribati nation in response to the
prolonged drought currently affecting that country; and

WHEREAS, the declaration was critically necessary considering
this extended period of drought caused by the lack of rainfall, for it has
resulted in an increase in the salinity of water sources throughout the lowlying atolls of the country; and

WHEREAS, so far this year, some areas of Kiribati have recorded less than 2.3 inches of total rainfall which has affected all 123,000 people residing in that nation, including 94,000 people in the severely impacted the Gilbert group, which is heavily dependent on rainwater harvesting; and

WHEREAS, exacerbated by the ongoing impacts of climate
change, the conditions which as caused this catastrophic drought are
forecasted to continue at least until the end of this year; and

WHEREAS, the people throughout Kiribati are being advised to
 conserve and use water wisely as long as these drought conditions continue
 to threaten their health and wellbeing; meanwhile,

WHEREAS, the declaration of the State of Disaster is allowing for
the coordination of efforts between Kiribati's National Disaster
Management Office and concerned local, national, regional and
international bodies to provide support and assistance to the people of
Kiribati during the crisis; and

9 WHEREAS, the United States, through the U.S. Agency for
10 International Development, (USAID), is providing \$500,000 in
11 humanitarian assistance to respond to the nation's State of Disaster; and

WHEREAS, U.S. officials in the region and
in Washington, D.C. are closely monitoring humanitarian impacts of this
drought in coordination with partners throughout the region; and

WHEREAS, as an example, this American sourced funding has allowed USAID to partner with the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) to immediately strengthen the capacity of the government to monitor groundwater sources, including their salinity levels, and to provide critical water conservation and treatment messaging to affected populations; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the especially harsh adverse effects that climate change is causing in the low-lying atolls of the Republic of Kiribati, the government of Australia is also providing valuable assistance to the people of Kiribati in meeting the challenges of the severe drought that is plaguing that nation; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the 39<sup>th</sup> General Assembly of the 1 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, State of Pohnpei, FSM, October 2 12-14, 2022, that this General Assembly hereby expresses our sincere 3 gratitude and appreciation for the timely assistance offered by the United 4 States, Australia and the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund to the 5 people of Kiribati to help them overcome the life-threatening challenges of 6 the prolonged drought that has placed that nation in a State of Disaster; and 7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the APIL President shall 8 certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof, and that 9 copies of the same shall be thereafter transmitted to the President of the 10 United States of America, to the Prime Minister of Australia, to the 11 Executive Director of the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund and 12 13 to the Chief Executive and the Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures. 14
