

A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 39-GA-09, CD1

"Relative to supporting the Republic of China (Taiwan) in its participation as observer at the World Health Organization's 76th World Health Assembly."

WHEREAS, one hundred eleven years ago, on October 10, 1911, the
Republic of China (Taiwan) was founded; and

WHEREAS, the islands of the Pacific and the Republic of China (Taiwan) have been friends and allies for many year; and throughout this time, the ties of friendship and the commercial interests of the people of the islands of the Pacific and the Republic of China (Taiwan) have developed into a strong partnership; and

8 WHEREAS, the theme of this year's 39th General Assembly of the 9 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures is "*Health is Wealth: Social and* 10 *Economic Well-Being of our APIL Community*"; and

WHEREAS, as often expressed by the Republic of China (Taiwan), we in the islands of the APIL Pacific also believe that good health is important to every citizen of the world and believe that access to the highest standard of health information and services is necessary to improve the public's health; and

WHEREAS, the Republic of China's (Taiwan's) achievements in the field of health are substantial, including one of the highest life expectancy levels in Asia; maternal and infant mortality rates comparable to those of western countries; the eradication of such infectious diseases as cholera, 1 smallpox, and the plague; and being the first nation to eradicate polio and provide children with Hepatitis B vaccinations; and 2

WHEREAS, the Republic of China (Taiwan) has been a strong 3 supporter of the health and well-being of the peoples of the Pacific islands and 4 has provided the islands with substantial assistance to improve our health 5 outcomes; and 6

WHEREAS, the peoples of the APIL Pacific are very fortunate that 7 during the COVID-19 pandemic which first began to sweep across the world 8 in the early months of 2020, the Republic of China (Taiwan) quickly and 9 unselfishly rushed to the aid of our people donating and transporting essential 10 supplies and medicines found necessary to combat this deadly disease; and 11

WHEREAS, the freedom and democracy enjoyed by the people of the 12 13 Republic of China (Taiwan) are clearly demonstrated in the progress and growth of the economy of this great country. In furthering its commitment to 14 freedom and democracy, Taiwan continues to seek representation and 15 16 meaningful participation in international organizations; and

WHEREAS, the preamble of the World Health Organization (WHO) 17 Constitution states that "the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of 18 health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being without 19 distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social condition."; 20 21 and

WHEREAS, the Republic of China (Taiwan), with 23,500,000 people, 22 has a population that is greater than three-fourths of member states already 23 admitted into the WHO; and 24

WHEREAS, it is the sense of the Association of Pacific Island 25 Legislatures that because health and disease have no borders, it is in the best 26 interest of the human condition of our whole world that the Republic of China 27 (Taiwan) be afforded access to international organizations devoted to the 28 world's health in order to benefit from information regarding the prevention, 29

monitoring and cure of epidemic diseases, prevention of terrorist bio-chemical 1

- attacks, and discussions of global health policies; and 2

WHEREAS, the World Health Assembly is the decision-making body of the World Health Organization. It is attended by delegations from all WHO 4 Member States and focuses on a specific health agenda prepared by the 5 Executive Board; and 6

WHEREAS, the main functions of the World Health Assembly are to 7 determine the policies of the World Health Organization, to appoint its 8 Director-General, to supervise financial policies, and to review and approve 9 10 the proposed programme budget; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Assembly has allowed observers to 11 participate in activities of the organization in the past, including the Palestine 12 13 Liberation Organization, the Order of Malta, and the Holy See; and

WHEREAS, during the G7 Foreign and Development Minister's 14 Meeting in May 2021, the G7 countries, comprised of Canada, France, 15 16 Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States have supported the inclusion of the Republic of China (Taiwan) at the World Health 17 Assembly through a joint communique; and 18

WHEREAS, the Seventy-sixth World Health Assembly is scheduled 19 to be held at the Palais des Nations, in Geneva, Switzerland, in the month of 20 21 May, 2023; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 22 39th General Assembly, FSM State of Pohnpei, October 12-14, 2022, that the 23 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby supports the Republic of 24 China's (Taiwan's) participation as an observer at the World Health 25 Organization's 76th World Health Assembly; and 26

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same shall thereafter be transmitted to the Director General of the World Health Organization, to the President of the Republic of China (Taiwan), and to the Chief Executive and the Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of the Pacific Island Legislatures.
