

A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 39-GA-12

"Requesting contributions by the APIL jurisdictions to the Bill Raynor Micronesia Challenge Scholarship Endowment Fund."

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Bill Raynor Micronesia 1 Challenge (BRMC) Scholarship Fund was inspired by the work of one of 2 Micronesia's conservation pioneers, William (Bill) Charles Raynor (Feb. 22, 3 1957-Sept. 1, 2015), former Director of The Nature Conservancy's 4 Micronesia Program; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Scholarship Fund aims to contribute to the development of effective conservation of Micronesia's biodiversity and the 7 promotion of sustainable livelihoods across the region; and 8

WHEREAS, this scholarship program provides an opportunity for
individuals from Micronesia to undertake either a Master's or Doctorate
degree in any resource management/conservation field at various institutions
within the Pacific Region, including universities in Guam, the US, Hawaii,
Fiji, Japan, New Zealand and Australia; and

WHEREAS, the selected scholars focus on leadership and technical
skills and/or majors that enhance their ability to carry out work in
conservation, climate adaptation and sustainable development in Micronesia;
and

1 WHEREAS, the Micronesia Conservation Trust (MCT) launched the Bill Raynor Micronesia Challenge Scholarship Program, supported by an 2 3 endowment fund, in 2017; and WHEREAS, MCT and partners of the Micronesia Challenge are fully 4 committed to supporting young Micronesians to pursue graduate degrees 5 6 under the BRMC and to return home to work after they graduate as a way to give back to their home islands; and 7 8 **WHEREAS**, since its inception, the BRMC Scholarship Program has supported twenty-one talented young Micronesians through their graduate 9 studies; and 10 11 **WHEREAS**, of these twenty-one scholars, fifteen have graduated and six are continuing with their studies; and 12 13 WHEREAS, twelve of the graduates are currently in Micronesia leading important work in agencies and organizations supporting the goals 14 and targets of the Micronesia Challenge; and 15 WHEREAS, the Micronesia Conservation Trust has received a 16 "Challenge Grant" award, whereby a U.S. based donor will contribute 17 US\$200,000 to the BRMC Scholarship Endowment Fund upon demonstration 18 of US\$100,000 in contributions raised in Micronesia; and 19 WHEREAS, MCT and partners have begun fundraising efforts to meet 20 this challenge and to reach the endowment goal of \$1.2M; now, therefore, 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific 22 Island Legislatures, 39th General Assembly, FSM State of Pohnpei, October 23 12-14, 2022, that this Assembly hereby fully endorses and supports the 24 aims and purposes of the Bill Raynor Micronesia Challenge Scholarship 25 Program and of its graduates, and current and future scholars; and 26

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Assembly hereby calls upon the APIL Member Governments to commit to making contributions to the BRMC Scholarship Endowment Fund, toward the achievement of the terms of the "Challenge Grant" of \$100,000 to bring the additional \$200,000 and, ultimately, towards the achievement of the targets, endorsed by this Assembly and the Micronesia Challenge; and

7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the APIL President shall certify 8 and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of 9 the same shall be transmitted to the Executive Director of the Micronesia 10 Conservation Trust and to the Chief Executive and Presiding Legislative 11 Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of Pacific Island 12 Legislatures.
