

A RESOLUTION

**APIL Resolution No. 39-GA-19** 

"Calling for the creation of an APIL Standing Committee on Conservation and Climate Change to engage in regional and international cooperation to address needed conservation and climate change policy on adaptation, mitigation, climate finance and for all other climate change purposes."

WHEREAS, the 39<sup>th</sup> APIL General Assembly adopted Resolution 38-GA 02 calling upon the APIL Member Jurisdictions to engage in regional cooperation
 to combat climate change and promote conservation best practices; and
 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the APIL that conservation and climate change

continue to be the greatest threat to the future survivability of all APIL Jurisdictions;
and

WHEREAS, during the 39<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, the Honorable Ed Case,
Hawaii Representative to the Congress of the United States, delivered a presentation
recommending the establishment of a Pacific Oceans Conservation Caucus to
engage in regional and international cooperation to address needed conservation and
climate change policy on adaptation, mitigation, climate finance and for all other
climate change purposes; and

WHEREAS, the presentation by the Honorable Ed Case has reinvigorated
APIL and its efforts to engage in regional and international cooperation on all
climate change issues; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, FSM
 State of Pohnpei, 39<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, October 12-14, 2022, that this General
 Assembly hereby calls for an APIL Standing Committee on Conservation and

Climate Change be created to engage in regional and international cooperation to
 address needed conservation and climate change policy on adaptation, mitigation,
 climate finance and for all other climate change purposes; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, FSM State of Pohnpei, October 12-14, 2022, that any member of the Legislatures of the APIL may be selected by its respective Speaker to be a member of this new APIL Committee; and

8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the APIL President shall certify and 9 the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same 10 shall be transmitted to the Chief Executive and Presiding Legislative Officers of 11 each Member Jurisdiction of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures.
