A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 40-GA-07

To improve access to the Pacific Power Association's resources and expertise.

WHEREAS, the theme of the 40th General Assembly: "Regional Security and Climate Change," encompasses the impact of climate change and natural disasters and particularly the effect that these events have on the energy sector, the design of energy production, and distribution infrastructure in the APIL member

WHEREAS, the Pacific Power Association or "PPA" was established in 1992 and currently has a membership of 25 electricity utilities operating in 22 Pacific Island Countries, and 77 Allied Members world-wide, including several APIL members; and

WHEREAS, the Pacific Power Association held its 30thAnnual Conference and Trade Exhibition on Saipan from the 25-28 September 2023; and

WHEREAS, in line with the 40th General Assembly's theme regarding regional security and climate change, the APIL, in a previous General Assembly, passed General Assembly Resolution No. 38-GA-02, "Calling on all APIL Member Jurisdictions to engage in regional cooperation to combat climate change through the continued development of, and commitment to, renewable energy," as well as Resolution No. 38-GA-13, titled, "To respectfully encourage APIL Members Jurisdictions to work together to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels and decrease carbon dioxide emissions in order to preserve the pristine environment of the APIL's Blue Continent," which are both consistent with the PPA's four strategic goals and objectives to wit: (1) using petroleum fuel more efficiently and reduce utility petroleum consumption; (2) building capacity to improve electricity supply & quality; (3) provision of services by PPA Secretariat

to improve electricity supply and quality; and (4) improving the financial sustainability of the utilities and the PPA Secretariat; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 40th General Assembly, FSM State of Chuuk, October 16-20, 2023, that the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby expresses its desire and commitment to explore more collaboration with the Pacific Power Association; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all APIL members are encouraged to promote more access to the considerable resources and the expertise that exists in the region for the development of the Pacific Islands' power sector, and to request that the PPA provide advice and guidance to ensure that all APIL member jurisdictions are adequately served; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same shall be thereafter transmitted to the Chief Executive and Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the APIL, to the Secretariat of the PPA, and to the PPA Chairman Hasmukh Patel.
