## **A RESOLUTION**

## **APIL Resolution No. 41-GA-07**

"Extending the sincere appreciation by the members of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures to the Honorable Members of the 118<sup>th</sup> U.S. Congress and to his Excellency, U.S. President Joseph Biden, Jr. for the inclusion in U.S. Public Law No. 118-42 of tuition assurances for the Freely Associated States' students attending U.S. colleges and universities."

1	WHEREAS, the theme of this year's General Assembly of the Association of Pacific
2	Island Legislatures is "Human development in Oceania: How can legislatures strengthen
3	people-centered security for the Pacific islanders? The state of and future perspectives on
4	food security, economic security, cybersecurity, and other indicators of human
5	development."; and
6	WHEREAS, attached to this theme is the principle that to truly accomplish the goals
7	of human development in our region of the world, our efforts must be "people-centered";
8	and
9	WHEREAS, it is the sense of the members of the Association of Pacific Island
10	Legislatures that a fully literate and educated population is essential to the security and
11	development of our region of the world; and
12	WHEREAS, the members of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures are
13	cognizant of the fact that U.S. Public Law No. 118-42, which was signed into effect on
14	March 8, 2024, includes the most recent, negotiated amendments to the Compacts of Free
15	Association, extending the financial provisions of the Compacts and updating federal
16	program services for another twenty years; and
17	WHEREAS, this United States law also provides that public institutions of higher
18	education in the United States that are admitting students who are citizens of the Federated
19	States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau to

study at their institutions should charge these Micronesian students at rates of tuition for

attendance that are not greater than the rates charged for residents of the State in which such a public institution of higher education is located; and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this 41<sup>st</sup> General Assembly of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures that this provision of U.S. Public Law No. 118-42 is essential for the educational development of the best and brightest of our youth of today, who will become the future leaders of our communities, of our states, of our nations, and of the blue continent of the APIL Pacific of tomorrow; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 41<sup>st</sup> General Assembly, Republic of Palau, August 12-13, 2024, that members of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby extend our sincere appreciation to the Honorable Members of the 118<sup>th</sup> U.S. Congress and to His Excellency, U.S. President Joseph Biden Jr., for the inclusion in U.S. Public Law No. 118-42 of tuition assurances for the Freely Associated States' students attending U.S. colleges and universities; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the APIL President shall certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same shall be transmitted to the President of the United States of America, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States Congress, to the President of the Senate of the United States Congress and to the Chief Executives and Legislative Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of the Pacific Island Legislatures.
