A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 42-GA-01

"Honoring and commending the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for his continuing dedication to preserving, protecting and promoting the advancement and welfare of our people throughout The Blue Continent, and extending to him our most fervent prayers and wishes for strength and courage as he courageously faces the challenges posed by leukemia."

- 1 WHEREAS, on the 21st day of April, 1959, the Honorable Diego Tenorio 2 Benavente was born to Roman Manahane Benavente and Dolores Tenorio Benavente, 3 and was raised in the Northern Marianas during the challenging era of the conclusion 4 of the administration of the U.N. Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands and the early 5 years of political enlightenment in the post TTPI era, where the challenges of bringing 6 democracy to our people was being experienced throughout the vast expanses of 7 Micronesia; and 8 WHEREAS, during the formative years of young adulthood, the Honorable 9 Diego Tenorio Benavente joined the efforts of colleagues all across our Pacific Region 10 of the world on our paths of discovery to the shores of self-rule and self-government; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente entered the world of
 - where world of politics in 1990, when he was first elected to the Seventh Northern Marianas

1 Commonwealth Legislature, and thereafter this freshman Legislator went on to 2 faithfully serve his people in the Northern Mariana Islands continuously through the 3 Twelfth Legislature, obtaining the leadership position of Speaker of the Ninth, Tenth, 4 and Eleventh Legislatures; and 5 WHEREAS, holding the top leadership positions in the Legislative Branch of 6 the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Honorable Diego Tenorio 7 Benavente stood at the forefront of CNMI's entry into the modern world where this 8 cherished statesman has led the way in promoting not only economic advancement, but 9 making great strides in protecting the health, education and welfare of his fellow 10 islanders; and 11 WHEREAS, in 2002, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente was elected 12 Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, serving 13 under Governor Juan N. Babauta until 2006, but later returned to the House of Representatives as a member of the Sixteenth and Seventeenth Northern Marianas 14 15 Commonwealth Legislatures, where he chaired and served on key committees until his 16 retirement from governmental service in 2011; and 17 WHEREAS, throughout his long career in full government service and in his 18 active years of retirement, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente has devoted his 19 attention, not only to the people of the Northern Marianas, but has also directed his 20 efforts to promoting the advancement and protection of the health and welfare of our 21 peoples throughout Micronesia, especially through his commitment to the mission and 22 goals of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures; and

1 WHEREAS, as a member of the Board of Directors of the APIL, Honorable 2 Diego Tenorio Benavente was instrumental in advancing many of the initiatives 3 embraced by the Association, through which this beloved statesman sought to explore 4 and to articulate our common needs and then to strengthen our shared priorities in a 5 multitude of fields such as economic growth, financial self-reliance and responsible 6 governance; and 7 WHEREAS, most notable among his accomplishments with the APIL, 8 Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente chaired the Task Force that led to the enduring 9 formation of the Pacific Islands Development Bank (PIDB), where he later served as 10 Chairman of the Bank's Board of Governors as well as serving as a Member of the 11 Bank's Board of Directors; and 12 WHEREAS, in 2023, in recognition of his devotion to the formation and 13 growth of the Pacific Islands Development Bank, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente was appointed by the PIDB Board of Directors as the first-ever Director 14 Emeritus; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente's passion for the 17 environment did not stop at the shores of the Northern Mariana Islands, for during his 18 fruitful years of public service, he has shared his passions and valuable expertise with 19 environmentalists throughout the Micronesian Islands, serving as a vital member of the 20 Board of the Micronesian Conservation Trust and a proud and effective advocate of the 21 Micronesian Challenge; and

1 WHEREAS, despite having been diagnosed with an advanced case of 2 leukemia, former Speaker and Lieutenant Governor Benavente continues to embrace 3 the challenges of not only his own life, but of all of those around him; and 4 WHEREAS, on October 27, 2025, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente spoke before the 65th Meeting of the APIL Board of Directors and delivered a stirring 5 6 message of strength and assurance that reminded us that the strength of our organization 7 is found in unity and in the camaraderie of all APIL members working together as one; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, former Speaker and Lieutenant Governor Benavente challenged 10 the APIL members that we must cultivate the next wave of island legislators, 11 economists and administrators who will carry our work forward long after our terms 12 have ended; and 13 WHEREAS, as the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente reminded us in his 14 remarks before the 65th Board of Directors, the strength of our islands can be seen in 15 the Chamorro Latte Stone—comprised of the haligi and the tasa that together uphold 16 the weight of the island home—symbolizing the balance between stability and 17 resilience that defines our people, and representing the dual strength of the APIL and 18 PIDB working together to sustain The Blue Continent; and 19 WHEREAS, the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente likewise compared the 20 unity of our Pacific community to the Carolinian Lighatúttúr, the traditional necklace 21 woven from countless small glass beads, each one unique yet bound together in

1 harmony and beauty, symbolizing how each island nation, though distinct, contributes 2 to the shared prosperity and resilience of The Blue Continent; and 3 WHEREAS, Delegates of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, speak 4 with one voice as we embrace the astonishing deeds and accomplishments of our 5 beloved and trusted colleague in the advancement of our islands and our people; now, 6 therefore, 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 42nd 8 General Assembly, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, October 28-29, 9 2025, that members of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby most 10 respectfully honor and commend the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente for his 11 continuing dedication to preserving, protecting and promoting the advancement and 12 welfare of our people throughout The Blue Continent; and 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Association of Pacific Island 14 Legislatures hereby recognizes the Chamorro Latte Stone, as invoked by the Honorable 15 Diego Tenorio Benavente in his address to the Board, as a living symbol of the dual 16 strength of the APIL and PIDB, representing the structural harmony between political 17 cooperation and economic self-reliance, and the strength and balance that has sustained 18 our people and our institutions through times of challenge and change; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Association of Pacific Island 19 20 Legislatures affirms the Carolinian Lighatúttúr, as expressed by the Honorable Diego 21 Tenorio Benavente, as a guiding metaphor for the interconnectedness and solidarity 22 among the peoples of The Blue Continent, reminding all member states that unity is the

- 1 foundation of regional prosperity and peace, as so eloquently articulated by him in his
- 2 address to the Board of Directors; and
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assembled Delegates of the
- 4 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures hereby extend to him our most fervent
- 5 prayers and wishes for the strength and the courage he continues to display as he faces
- 6 the effects of leukemia; and
- 7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the APIL President shall certify, and the
- 8 APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall
- 9 thereafter be transmitted to the Honorable Diego Tenorio Benavente; and to the Chief
- 10 Executives and Presiding Legislative Officers of each member jurisdiction of the
- 11 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures.
