A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 42-GA-04

"Urging member states of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures to cooperate in combating the use and trafficking of illegal drugs through enhanced border security, law enforcement training, and rehabilitation programs."

WHEREAS, the increasing prevalence of illegal drugs poses a serious threat 1 to the health, safety, and well-being of the peoples of the Pacific Islands; and 2 WHEREAS, illegal drug activities undermine social stability, economic 3 productivity, and the moral integrity of communities across the region; and 4 WHEREAS, the trafficking of illegal drugs often exploits the geographic 5 vulnerabilities and limited resources of small island jurisdictions; and 6 WHEREAS, effective prevention and control of illegal drug trafficking 7 require close cooperation, information sharing, and joint capacity-building among 8 all Member States of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures; and 9 WHEREAS, strengthening border control and improving the training of 10 police, customs, immigration, and postal inspection officers are critical to 11 preventing the entry and spread of illegal drugs; and 12 WHEREAS, the use of modern technologies to monitor and track incoming 13 shipments at all ports of entry -- including airports, seaports, and postal facilities --14 is vital to identifying and intercepting illegal substances; and 15 WHEREAS, the creation of accessible and effective drug rehabilitation and 16 reintegration programs is essential to the recovery, healing, and reintegration of 17 individuals affected by substance abuse; now, therefore, 18 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures that 19

1. Work cooperatively to combat the use, trafficking, and distribution of 1 illegal drugs within and among Member States; 2. Strengthen border control measures at all ports of entry, including 3 airports, seaports, and postal facilities; 4 3. Enhance training programs for police officers, K-9 officers, customs 5 officers, biosecurity officers, coastal fisheries officers, immigration 6 officers, and postal inspectors on the use of modern technologies and 7 investigative methods to detect and intercept illegal drugs; 8 4. Share intelligence, information, and best practices among Member 9 States to improve regional enforcement coordination; and 10 5. Develop and maintain rehabilitation programs to assist individuals 11 affected by drug addiction and support their reintegration into society. 12 13 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 42nd General Assembly on Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, 14 October 28-29, 2025, that the members of the Association of the Pacific Island 15 Legislatures, hereby urges member states of the Association of Pacific Island 16 Legislatures to cooperate in combating the use and trafficking of illegal drugs 17 through enhanced border security, law enforcement training, and rehabilitation 18 programs; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that APIL President shall certify, and the 20 APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall 21 be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Terrance C. "Terry" Cole, Administrator of the 22 United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA); to the Honorable Doug 23 Burgum, Secretary of the United States Department of the Interior (DOI); to the 24
