A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 42-GA-08

"To address the rising cost of fuel in the Pacific region, to request and advocate for the assistance of the U.S. Department of War in working with the United States Government to reevaluate fuel supply routes to the islands throughout the Blue Continent."

WHEREAS, the islands of the Pacific, including the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) and the broader Blue Continent, continue to

3 experience high fuel costs that significantly impact the cost of living, transportation,

4 power generation, and economic development; and

WHEREAS, the majority of fuel currently supplied to Hawaii and the surrounding Pacific islands originates from Singapore and other foreign markets, resulting in higher shipping and logistical costs; and

WHEREAS, the Trump Administration and subsequent U.S. policies have emphasized the importance of American energy independence by promoting domestic drilling and encouraging U.S. states and territories to play a greater role in supplying fuel to the nation and its associated territories; and

WHEREAS, the CNMI and other U.S.-affiliated islands occupy a vital and strategic location in the Pacific region, hosting key defense, economic, and transportation activities essential to U.S. national security and regional stability; and

WHEREAS, it is both timely and in the national interest that the U.S. Department of War (DOW) collaborate with the Department of Energy (DOE), the Department of Transportation (DOT), and other relevant federal agencies to explore alternative, cost-effective, and secure fuel supply chains for the Pacific territories;

WHEREAS, currently faces logistical challenges due to the constraints of 1 the Merchant Marine Act of 1920, also known as the Jones Act, which requires that 2 goods transported between U.S. ports be carried on U.S.-built, U.S.-flagged vessels 3 crewed by U.S. citizens, thereby limiting competition and contributing to higher 4 shipping costs; and 5 WHEREAS, the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL) consists 6 of the legislative members from the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana 7 Islands, Guam, Republic of Palau, Republic of the Marshalls, Republic of Kiribati, 8 9 Republic of Nauru, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM State of Chuuk, FSM State of Kosrae, FSM State of Pohnpei, FSM State of Yap), American Samoa, and 10 Hawaii; and 11 12 WHEREAS, APIL represents the people in the Blue Continent stretching 13 through a region separated by vast expanse of the open ocean, but unite collaboratively in partnerships to find solutions of fuel cost as they all share the 14 same experiences and struggles; now, therefore, 15 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Association of Pacific Island Legislature 16 hereby requests and strongly urges the U.S. Department of War to take a leadership 17 role in advocating for and assisting Pacific territories, in efforts to reevaluate the 18 current fuel supply system and to develop strategies that promote cost reduction, 19 reliability, and energy security; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Association of Pacific Island 21 Legislatures respectfully requests that the United States to consider exploring 22 statutory and regulatory relief measures that would allow for more competitive and 23 affordable fuel shipping options; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the APIL President shall certify, and 25 the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that certified copies of 26 this Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the Secretary of 27 Defense, the Secretary of Energy, the Secretary of Transportation, the CNMI 28 Delegate to the U.S. Congress, to the Honorable Governors of the U.S. Pacific

- 2 Representatives, to the Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
- 3 Islands and the Presiding Officers of the NMC Legislature, and to the Chief
