A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 42-GA-14

"Supporting the First Annual Micronesian Regional Educational Summit; affirming the commitment of Micronesian Leaders to advance quality, cultural relevance, and equitable education systems; and encouraging sustained regional collaboration to strengthen education across Micronesia."

1	WHEREAS, under the leadership of Her Excellency Dr. Hilda C. Heine,
2	President of the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the 27th Micronesian Islands
3	Forum (MIF) highlighted education as a top regional priority for sustainable
4	development and social resilience across Micronesia; and
5	WHEREAS, the Honorable David M. Apatang, Governor of the
6	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, led the CNMI delegation to the
7	27th MIF convened in Majuro, Republic of the Marshall Islands, from June 30 to
8	July 4, 2025, where regional leaders reaffirmed their shared commitment to
9	strengthening quality, equitable, and culturally grounded education systems; and
10	WHEREAS, the 27th MIF Joint Communiqué formally endorsed the
11	Regional Education Committee's report and reaffirmed its collective objectives to:
12	1. Advance teacher training and workforce development;
13	2. Enhance digital and distance learning capabilities;
14	3. Expand access to culturally and linguistically relevant curriculum
15	and resources;
16	4. Strengthen regional education data, research collaboration, and
17	innovation networks; and

1	5. Mobilize sustained funding and partnerships with regional and
2	international development partners; and
3	WHEREAS, the leaders called for deeper coordination among education
4	ministries, universities, and legislative bodies to align policies and sustain progress
5	on these commitments, with the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL)
6	recognized as a key regional partner in promoting legislative support and
7	cooperation; and
8	WHEREAS, APIL recognizes that education is fundamental to regional
9	stability, workforce development, and the preservation of indigenous languages,
10	cultures, and values that define Micronesia's shared identity; and
11	WHEREAS, the Micronesian Islands Forum (MIF) Regional Education
12	Committee, in its 2025 findings, identified shared challenges including shortages of
13	skilled workers, out-migration of talent, limited culturally relevant learning
14	resources, shifting funding landscapes, and evolving educational technologies; and
15	WHEREAS, the Committee emphasized the importance of strengthening
16	educational quality, cultural relevance, equity of access, and sustained funding
17	support to ensure all students in Micronesia have equitable opportunities to learn
18	and thrive; and
19	WHEREAS, collaboration among APIL member jurisdictions provides
20	opportunities to share best practices, coordinate capacity-building, leverage limited
21	technical resources, and elevate regional advocacy; and
22	WHEREAS, APIL has previously recognized the importance of regional
23	capacity-building partnerships and collaboration with development partners across
24	critical sectors, including education; now, therefore,

1	BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 42nd
2	General Assembly on Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands,
3	October 28-29, 2025, that the members hereby express their full support for the First
4	Annual Micronesian Regional Education Summit to be convened in April 2026
5	under the auspices of the Micronesian Islands Forum and its Regional Education
6	Committee; and
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the APIL hereby endorse the
8	convening of an Annual Micronesian Regional Education Summit, to be hosted on
9	a rotational basis among jurisdictions represented in the Micronesian Islands
10	Forum and APIL member states; and
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that APIL urges all member jurisdictions
12	to participate actively in the Summit, contribute to its agenda, and align legislative
13	and policy frameworks that advance quality education, teacher development, and
14	the integration of indigenous languages and values in school systems; and
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that APIL commits to ongoing regional
16	advocacy to secure sustained funding for teacher training, digital access, locally
17	developed curriculum, and community-based cultural education; and
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the First Annual Regional Education
19	Summit shall be held in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands
20	(CNMI) in April 2026, with the host jurisdiction coordinating with education
21	ministries, boards, universities, and regional partners to establish the agenda and
22	implementation framework; and
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that APIL members commit to
24	coordinated regional advocacy to secure sustained and predictable funding for
25	teacher training, workforce development, culturally relevant curriculum, digital
26	access, and community-based cultural education; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the APIL President shall certify and

2 the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof, and that copies of this

3 resolution be transmitted to the Micronesian Islands Forum Secretariat; the Pacific

4 Islands Forum Secretariat; the U.S. Department of the Interior – Office of Insular

5 Affairs; the Pacific Islands Development Bank; UNESCO; to the heads of

6 government and Presiding Legislative Officers of each APIL member jurisdiction

7 of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures.
