A RESOLUTION

Resolution No. 53-BOD-12

"Relative to the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures' expressed support and advocacy for alternate dispute resolution and language services."

- WHEREAS, the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL) acknowledges the
- 2 Judiciary of Guam's position that Guam, in serving as a gateway to the United States from
- 3 Asia, continues to experience population growth; and
- 4 WHEREAS, APIL acknowledges the leadership of Chief Justice F. Philip Carbullido
- 5 in working to establish partnerships with community stakeholders inclusive of, but not
- 6 limited to, instrumentalities of the government as well as with private volunteer organizations
- 7 in order that they may jointly assess and address the needs of a growing population; and
- 8 WHEREAS, APIL further acknowledges that the court is currently unable to satisfy
- 9 the corresponding increased need for language interpreters and alternate dispute resolution
- and other language services; now, therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 53rd Board of
- Directors Meeting, December 5-6, 2012, State of Pohnpei, FSM, that the Board of Directors
- of the APIL hereby expresses its support of and advocacy of the Judiciary of Guam's
- initiatives to establish or enhance alternate dispute resolution and language service programs;

- 2 Secretary of APIL shall attest, to the adoption hereof, and that copies thereupon be
- 3 transmitted to Chief Justice F. Philip Carbullido and to the Chief Executives and Legislative
- 4 Presiding Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of the Pacific Island
- 5 Legislatures.
