"Applauding the initiative undertaken by the Hawaii State Legislature in commencing an active program to achieve the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals in the upcoming years and encouraging all of our legislative assemblies that compose the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures to adopt and implement similar programs so that all of our island jurisdictions of the "Blue Continent" can be recognized as global leaders for sustainable growth on the world stage."

WHEREAS, after many years of arduous work and many conferences and 1 meetings, Resolution 70/1 was adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations in 2 3 2015, entitled "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development"; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the 2015 U.N. Resolution sets forth 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals or SDGs; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the 17 SDGs by which the United Nations is seeking to transform the world by the Year 2030 are as follows: 8 Goal 1: No poverty 9 10 Goal 2: Zero hunger Goal 3: Good health and well-being for people 11 Goal 4: Quality education 12 Goal 5: Gender equality 13 Goal 6: Clean water and sanitation 14

Goal 7: Affordable and clean energy
Goal 8: Decent work and economic growth
Goal 9: Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure

Goal 10: Reducing inequalities

1 Goal 11: Sustainable cities and communities Goal 12: Responsible consumption and production 2 Goal 13: Climate action 3 Goal 14: Life below water 4 Goal 15: Life on land 5 Goal 16: Peace, justice and strong institutions 6 Goal 17: Partnerships for the goals; and 7 WHEREAS, as of the 25th of September 2015, 193 member countries of the 8 United Nations, inclusive of the many nations of the Pacific Ocean, have adopted the 9 2030 Development Agenda, which agenda outlines the 17 Sustainable Development 10 Goals and 169 associated targets; and 11 WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Association of Pacific Island 12 Legislatures finds itself in full support of the 17 SDGs outlined above, but in so doing we 13 fully realize that to achieve these 17 goals and the 169 associated targets, it is not enough 14 to just sign onto the convention; because 15 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the APIL Board of Directors that affirmative action 16 must be initiated at all levels of society to achieve these goals and targets, and creative 17 programs must be implemented as soon as possible for the Year 2030 is just a mere 10 18 years away; and 19 WHEREAS, the APIL Board of Directors hereby recognizes the leading role that 20 the Hawaii State Legislature has assumed in our region of the world by officially 21 adopting the 17 SDGs in its 2018 Regular Session, and hereby commends the Hawaii 22 23 State Legislature for its expressed commitment to commence a program to accomplish seven of these goals in its 2019 Regular Session; now, therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Association of Pacific 25 Island Legislatures, 59th Board Meeting, January 30 to February 2, 2019, FSM State of 26 Yap, that the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Association of Pacific Island 27 28 Legislatures, hereby applauds the initiative undertaken by the Hawaii State Legislature in commencing an active program to achieve the 17 United Nations Sustainable 29 Development Goals in the upcoming years, and encourages all of our legislative 30
