A RESOLUTION

Resolution No. 61-BOD-09

"Supporting an APIL Regional Marine Spatial Planning Program."

- WHEREAS, APIL members have consistently been global leaders in marine conservation, both at the national and regional scale; and
- WHEREAS, APIL members depend on the sustainable management and harvest of their marine resources for financial and food security; and
- WHEREAS, evidence shows that coordinated, science-based ocean management strategies can enhance the environmental and socio-economic resilience of APIL members; and
- WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has created unprecedented economic, social and health challenges for APIL members, but also new opportunities for solidarity, coordination and cooperation; and
 - WHEREAS, APIL members support Palau's efforts to re-evaluate current marine resource management strategies including fisheries development, marine protected areas and innovative business models to maximize benefits to Palau's citizens as well as institute proven and effective conservation measures; and

- WHEREAS, Palau has solicited support from The Nature
- 2 Conservancy to develop and implement a "Blue Economy Business Plan"
- which creates a pathway for Palau to remain a conservation leader, to
- 4 enhance the well-being of its people, and to test a potentially-replicable
- 5 model for APIL members; now, therefore,
- 6 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Association of
- 7 Pacific Island Legislatures, 61st Board Meeting, February 17-18, 2022, via
- 8 ZOOM Conferencing, that the Board of Directors on behalf of the
- 9 Association of Pacific Island Legislatures extends support and solidarity
- with the Government of Palau in its efforts to develop its blue economy
- consistent with their people's aspirations, needs and priorities; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the it is the sense of this APIL
- 13 Board of Directors that our Association should explore opportunities for
- undertaking a regional "Marine Spatial Planning (MSP)" effort that utilizes
- science-based methods to develop an MSP Roadmap for the APIL member
- states including recommendations on coordination opportunities around
- 17 fisheries aquaculture management, protected areas designation and
- management, environmental restoration, sustainable financing and economic
- development options"; and ask
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL Board of Directors
- further implores the APIL President to formally request the support of The
- Nature Conservancy, which has a demonstrated track record in supporting
- countries with unbiased, science-based Marine Spatial Planning processes to
- 24 assist the Member Jurisdictions of the APIL, in close coordination with key
- 25 regional institutions, in the development of a truly regional Marine Spatial
- 26 Planning Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that APIL President shall certify

- and the APIL Secretary attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the
- 3 same shall be transmitted to the Chief Executives and the Presiding
- 4 Legislative Officers of the member jurisdictions of the Association of the
- 5 Pacific Island Legislatures.
