A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 62-BOD-10

"To convey heartfelt sympathies and condolences to the family, relatives, and friends of the late former Senator Haruo Esang for his untimely passing, and to memorialize his long and devoted career in public service and his many contributions to our people as a warmly remembered founding statesman of the Republic of Palau and as an exceptionally talented former President of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures."

- WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang was born on January 29, 1938
- 2 in Tokyo, Japan to the late Esang Ucherbelau and Hatsuko Eanisima; and
- WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang attended Mindszenty High
- 4 School and completed his secondary education at John F. Kennedy High School in
- 5 Guam; he also attended the Trust Territory Nursing School in Palau from 1954 to 1956;
- and from 1964 to 1968, he attended the University of Guam majoring in Business
- 7 Administration; and
- WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang worked as nurse at the Palau
- 9 MacDonald Memorial Hospital in Palau from 1955 to 1966, then in 1976 he became the
- manager of the Western Carolines Trading Company (WCTC) when it came under
- receivership of the Trust Territory Government; and
- WHEREAS, from 1975 to 1978, the late former Senator Haruo Esang worked as
- an Economist for the Economic Development Division, former Trust Territory of the
- Pacific Islands (TTPI) Headquarters in Saipan; thereafter, from 1980 to 1984 he was
- employed by the Office of Planning and Statistics as a Statistics Specialist and later
- became the Chief of the Statistics Division; and
- WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang won the Special Election in
- 18 1985 to fill the vacant seat of the Senate of the Second Olbiil Era Kelulau, when Lazarus
- 19 E. Salii became President of the Republic of Palau; and

WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang served as a member of the 1 2 Senate of the Second Olbiil Era Kelulau from 1985 to 1987, during which time he served on the Senate Committees on Resources and Development, Ways and Means, and 3 Foreign Affairs; and when the Senate reorganized in October of 1986, he was elected 4 Vice President of the Senate; and 5 WHEREAS, in 1988, the late former Senator Haruo Esang was re-elected to the 6 7 Senate of the Third Olbiil Era Kelulau, and served as the Senate Vice President and Chairman of the Senate Committee on Health and Social Welfare from 1989 to 1992; he 8 was re-elected to the Senate of the Fourth Olbiil Era Kelulau, and continued to serve as 9 the Senate Vice President and Chairman of the Senate Committee on Health and Social 10 Welfare from 1993 to 1996; and the late former Senator Haruo Esang was re-elected to 11 the Fifth Olbiil Era Kelulau, where he continued to serve as the Senate Vice President 12 and was the Vice Chairman of the Senate Committee on Health and Social Welfare; and 13 WHEREAS, during the late former Senator Haruo Esang's tenure as a member of 14 the Senate, he was most active in the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures (APIL) 15 representing the Senate to the APIL General Assembly meetings in the region; and 16 WHEREAS, in 1993, during the APIL General Assembly held in Palau, the late 17 Senator Haruo Esang was elected Secretary of APIL and served as the Chairman of the 18 Transportation Committee; in 1995, he was elected as the President of APIL during the 19 14th General Assembly in Pohnpei, FSM; the late former Senator Haruo Esang was re-20 elected President of APIL during the 15th APIL General Assembly in Palau; and 21 WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang continued his public service 22 after retiring as Vice President of the Senate; he was a consultant to former President 23 Tommy E. Remengesau, Jr., a member of the Board of Directors of the Palau Visitors 24 Authority, and Chairman of the Public Health Community Support Group; and 25 WHEREAS, the late former Senator Haruo Esang was also an avid businessman 26 27 who started his own private business in Saipan during the TTPI era; he later established several businesses in Palau, including the United Trust Construction Company (UTCC), 28 29 GF Enterprise Incorporated, GF Automotive, GF Auto Parts, HE Budget Marts, and 30 Space Rentals; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Haruo Esang, Senator, will forever be remembered as a true inspiration and example of upstanding citizenry, with all the qualities and characteristics of a citizen dedicated to making a positive impact on our community; and

WHEREAS, the former Senator Haruo Esang was called to his eternal rest on Saturday, April 1, 2023 at the age of 85; now, therefore,

 \boldsymbol{BE} IT $\boldsymbol{RESOLVED}$ by the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 62^{nd} Board Meeting, April 5-6 2023, that the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, hereby conveys heartfelt sympathies and condolences to the family, relatives, and friends of the late former Senator Haruo Esang for his untimely passing, and to memorialize his public services and contributions to the country of the Republic of Palau and to the APIL Pacific; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify and the APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall be transmitted to the Chief Executives and Presiding Legislative Officers of each member jurisdiction of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures.
