A RESOLUTION

APIL Resolution No. 64-BOD-08

"CALLING FOR COORDINATION BETWEEN THE ASSOCIATION OF PACIFIC ISLAND LEGISLATURES (APIL), THE INDO-PACOM, AND JOINT TASKFORCE MICRONESIA (JTM) TO ESTABLISH A HUMANITARIAN SUPPORT NETWORK IN THE PACIFIC."

WHEREAS, the Indo-Pacific Command (Indo-PACOM) plays a critical role in maintaining regional stability and security in the Pacific region, including through disaster response and humanitarian assistance initiatives; and

WHEREAS, United States Navy Admiral Samuel J. Paparo, Jr., and Joint Taskforce Micronesia (JTM) have recognized the need for increased humanitarian coordination and support to address the unique challenges faced by Pacific Island nations; and

WHEREAS, the Ayuda Foundation, as a creation of APIL, presents a significant opportunity to enhance humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR) efforts in the region through multi-sector collaboration; and

WHEREAS, effective disaster response and humanitarian aid require an integrated approach that aligns military capabilities, government policies, and non-governmental efforts to ensure timely and efficient relief; and

WHEREAS, the success of humanitarian missions in the Pacific hinges on the alignment of the humanitarian component as the third pillar, complementing the existing security and training efforts; and

WHEREAS, establishing structured training programs that incorporate a humanitarian lens will help bridge gaps in response capacity, particularly during times of drought and climate-related crises; and

WHEREAS, fostering regional partnerships with Indo-PACOM, JTM, and the Ayuda Foundation will provide the necessary framework to enhance long-term resilience and disaster preparedness in the Pacific; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, at its 64th Board Meeting, February 25-26, 2025, in Majuro, Republic of the Marshall Islands, that the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, hereby formally endorses this Resolution and calls for the coordination of Indo-PACOM, Joint Task Force-Micronesia, the Ayuda

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Foundation and APIL in establishing an operational humanitarian support network in the Pacific; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL urges its member jurisdictions to work in collaboration with Indo-PACOM, JTF-M, and the Ayuda Foundation to integrate humanitarian training into existing security and disaster response frameworks; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, 64th Board of Directors meeting, Majuro, Republic of the Marshall Islands, February 25-26, 2025, that the Board of Directors, on behalf of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, hereby calls for coordination between the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, the INDO-PACOM, the Joint Task Force - Micronesia and the Ayuda Foundation to establish a humanitarian support network in the Pacific to assist all member states and the people of the region in a manner that aligns with their training missions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the APIL President shall certify, and the
APIL Secretary shall attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same shall be
thereafter transmitted to the U.S. Navy Admiral Samuel J. Paparo Jr., Commander, U.S.
Indo-Pacific Command; to Rear Admiral Greg Hoffman, Commander Joint Task ForceMicronesia, and to Ms. Carlotta Leon Guerrero, Executive Director of the Ayuda
Foundation, and to the Chief Executives and Legislative Presiding Officers of each
member jurisdiction of the APIL.
